This announcement is for an Aircraft Maintenance Technician for RavnAir Group. This position reports to the Lead Mechanic for RavnAir Connect and is responsible for repairs and maintenance on assigned aircraft, under supervision or as trained and qualified to perform. The successful candidate will have a valid FAA mechanic certificate with an Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) rating and one year or more of experience repairing and maintaining aircraft, preferably turboprop.

This is a non-exempt, full time, benefits-eligible position. Position typically works four 10-hour days in Palmer, however overtime may be required as dictated by business needs and with management approval.

Minimum Qualifications

- High School Diploma/GED required;
- Must have a valid FAA Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) certificate;
- Requires some experience working as a licensed A&P mechanic on aircraft, preferably large turboprops;
- Must have a valid Driver's License with a good driving record according to the company's insurance policy;
- Demonstrated mechanical knowledge of Cessna C207, Cessna C208, Beech 1900C, and PA31 Chieftain aircraft or similar turboprop aircraft is highly desired;
- Must be able to effectively troubleshoot all aircraft systems;
- Ability to read and interpret technical manuals and drawings to perform required maintenance tasks;
- Detail-oriented with the ability to prioritize multiple tasks;
- Good written and verbal communication skills;
- Proficient, or able to become proficient, in all documentation of paperwork using maintenance tracking software program, including material requisitions;
- Detail-oriented with the ability to prioritize multiple tasks;
- Requires a strong safety awareness and the ability to adhere to Safety Management Systems (SMS);

- Able to pass a comprehensive background check;
- Comfortable working in an airport environment around odors and sounds typically associated with operating aircraft.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Responsible for repairs and maintenance on assigned Company aircraft;
- Removes/disassembles parts as required then assembles and installs replacement parts and components as needed;
- Assists in troubleshooting of maintenance issues involving aircraft structures, systems, and engines;
- Performs modifications per FAA regulations and company General Maintenance Manual (GMM);
- Completes all necessary maintenance records and paperwork as required;
- Responsible for promoting identification and reporting of safety hazards in the work environment or when confronted with an unsafe situation. Promotes a positive Safety Culture with co-workers and supports the maintenance organization in compliance with Safety Management System (SMS);
- Other duties as assigned and within the scope of this position.
